## ATTENTION Stokes County Students Grades 3 - 8



The Stokes County Arts Council, in partnership with Stokes County Schools, is now taking applications for the 2022/2023 **Junior Appalachian Musician / JAM** traditional music instruction program for kids. The program will consist of weekly group lessons on stringed traditional instruments. Classes will take place on the following days and locations;

**Monday – King Senior Center (King Recreation Acres)**

**Tuesday – Pinnacle Elementary**

**Tuesday / Wednesday – Walnut Cove Elementary**

**Thursday – Lawsonville Elementary**

Classes meet one day per week for 60 minutes, and will be scheduled either afterschool or between 4pm – 7:15pm, with final class groupings times to be determined by the instructor. In addition to lessons, the program will include performance opportunities at The Arts Place venue and events such as the Stokes Stomp Festival and Art on Main.

Instruction will be offered on GUITAR, MANDOLIN, FIDDLE, BANJO, and BASS at all four locations, with DULCIMER and UKULELE also offered at the Walnut Cove and Lawsonville sites.

Fees will be \$5 per class. Scholarships are available for students who qualify for free and reduced fee lunches. There are instruments available on a loan basis from the Stokes County Arts Council or you may provide your own.

SPACES ARE LIMITED AND ON A FIRST COME FIRST SERVE BASIS. Students must be able to commit to the full program, which begins in October and runs through the end of April, so please evaluate any possible conflicts due to sports or other activities.
